# 2017 Dr. Ron Bot

#### **Background:**

We made a killer, one-off Rhone blend back in 2013 and didn't realize what a nice addition to our permanent portfolio it would be. After watching how incredibly that wine evolved and how people reacted to it, we brought Dr. Ron Bot back as a regular character in our cast a few years later. This vintage is an even balance of depth and richness from Syrah; bright red fruit, spice and gritty tannin of Mourvedre; and soft, strawberry fruit from Grenache. There are a lot of layers to unravel in this one, and it should only get more interesting with time. This is our largest blend of the year at a whopping 12 barrels.

## Varietal Composition and Appellation/Fruit Sourcing:

Willcox AVA

33% Syrah from Cimarron Vineyard. Cochise County, AZ, 4,300 ft. elevation. Harvested Aug. 11th

17% Mourvedre from Cimarron Vineyard. Cochise County, AZ, 4,300 ft. elevation. Harvested Sept. 1st

17% Mourvedre from Pillsbury Vineyard. Cochise County, AZ. 4,300 ft. elevation. Harvested Sept. 12th

17% Grenache from Cimarron Vineyard. Cochise County, AZ. 4,300 ft. elevation. Harvested Aug. 16th

16% Grenache from Pillsbury Vineyard. Cochise County, AZ, 4,300 ft. elevation. Harvested Aug. 18th

Sugar at harvest: 24.5 Brix average

#### **Cellar Notes:**

Destemmed but not crushed to open-top, ¾- and 1.5-ton bins. All lots were left 8-20% whole cluster except Pillsbury Mourvedre. Cold-soaked 24 hours, then inoculated with specially selected yeasts (Rhone2056, D254, CLOS, D80 & VRB).

Hand punched 3-4 times daily.

Inoculated with Malolactic bacteria (Omega) around 7 Brix.

Pressed at dryness after 9 days average skin contact.

Settled 3 days average before barreling.

## Aging:

Aged 4+ months in 17% 2-year-old and 8% 1-year-old French oak barrels. Aged another 7 months in 8% 2-year-old and 8% 1-year-old French oak barrels (Rousseau, Gillet & Ermitage Cooperages). Twice racked. Filtered, but unfined.
